Dear Sacred Heart families and friends,

Latest Changes To Restrictions,

As metropolitan Melbourne moved to step three of the roadmap to reopening, we eagerly awaited news of how this would impact on schools. On this occasion we didn't have to wait long as the latest updated School Operations Guide was sent to schools. Whilst most of the current restrictions will remain in place in schools, there has been some easing. One of the highlights for us was finding out that we are now able to have our 2021 Prep students come onsite for transition sessions in small groups. We will be setting this process up in coming weeks. It was quite clear that schools could conduct a graduation ceremony - but we are restricted to the children in the relevant year level and staff. How we share this experience with parents will require some ingenuity. We are still not permitted to sing in groups so our Carols night will need to be cancelled for 2020. We are permitted to have allied health staff onsite to assist in children's learning and behavioural needs. Excursions and camps are still not allowed. We are still not permitted to gather in groups larger than a class or year level. Hopefully over the weekend more restrictions will be lifted and we will have a clearer idea on what can and cannot be done in 2020.

Swimming Lessons:

We apologise for the inconvenience in regards to late information this year but as you can appreciate, the directives continue to change and we need to ensure we have the Department of Education and Catholic Education Melbourne directives before proceeding with a number of decisions. We have been in contact with the Diamond Creek Outdoor Pool and although schools can attend outdoor swimming pools the actual swimming coaches have not been given the go ahead to coach/teach. There is still no further easing

of restrictions for swimming coaches and due to the need to work out financial reimbursements we have, with support from the pool, decided to cancel swimming lessons for 2020.

Finances:

In the coming weeks we will communicate the reimbursement of fees that have not been used in 2020. Please be patient as we work this out with the release of new restrictions hopefully after this weekend.

School Photos:

Advanced Life Photography will be on site tomorrow to take individual photos and sibling photos for the students. They will then use these individual photos to form composite group photos for the students. Reminder students must wear their correct **summer uniform** for these photos.

Staff News:

We wish Gemma Greenwood the best of luck as she begins her maternity leave tomorrow. We welcome Jess Clark who will be teaching Prep along with Kerry Neilson.

Advisory Board and Parents Association 2021:

The Annual General Meeting of the Advisory Board and Parents Association will be postponed until the start of 2021. This is an opportunity to elect new members and welcome back existing members, especially after a different year. Both these representative groups impact the school and can make a difference to your children's school.

Parents Association

It is primarily a group of interested parents/carers who organise and run various social, fundraising, and 'service' activities throughout the year, with a view to providing a sum of money at the end of the year for something the school requires, usually earmarked by the Principal in consultation with the School Advisory Board, or several smaller projects throughout the year.

The Parents' Association also provides gifts for teachers/staff members leaving or retiring, bereavement cards for school families, etc.; assists or conducts various morning teas or suppers associated with school functions e.g., first day of school, grade six parent's farewell, prep parent's information night etc. Sometimes charitable donations are made in special cases with the approval of the Committee.

You can see that the Parents' Association fills many varied rolls and is a vital part of school life. The various roles within the committee can be whatever people can manage, or as involved as they have the energy to make them. The challenge is to get people interested and continually renew the committee.

Advisory Board

The responsibilities of the Board are:

To actively support Catholic education as described in the Code of Canon Law (canons 793–806) and in the directions and guidelines determined by the Archbishop, by:

- maintaining the Catholic identity and nature of the school
- sponsoring a comprehensive curriculum which underpins the specific Catholic ethos of the school
- promoting the best possible pastoral care of students and of members of the school community
- Monitoring and maintaining the schools Child Safe Standards
- Maintaining the physical environment of the school.

INSIGHTS

Give kids a thumbs up for the right things



Children of all ages enjoy parental recognition. They like when their parents make a fuss over their behaviour or highlight something they've done well.

Sometimes parents will reward their children's behaviour with a treat, money or a gift. This is okay in small doses, but parental recognition alone is a high enough driver of children's behaviour most of the time.

First borns, in particular, love approval. Youngest children just love that you have noticed them! Second borns can sometimes do things in spite of their parents, but deep down they love the recognition too, even if they don't let on that they do.

The behaviour you focus on expands

If you want your kids to be neater then focus on their neat behaviours. "You've tidled your toys up before dinner. Top job!" You don't have to throw a party, just let them know that you noticed and you approve of their tidiness. You may also let them know how it affects you. "You've tidled your toys up before dinner. It makes my job easier." The behaviours that you notice and comment on will expand.

Noticing kids' tidiness once won't suddenly turn messy kids into exceptionally neat ones, but do it often enough and you'll start to get some turn around.

You can give kids a thumbs up for all sorts of behaviours. Here's some examples.

Being co-operative

Stubborn kids need a pat on the head when they respond on your terms not theirs.

Being brave

Nervous and anxious kids need to have their bravery pointed out to them. It's reassuring and empowering.

Being helpful

Want helpful kids? Then you need to notice helpful behaviours.

Being tolerant

Sometimes older siblings need to be very tolerant of younger siblings. Tolerance is a very giving behaviour and should be promoted.

Being patient

Something to encourage in boys, in particular. It's often not their strong point.

Being persistent

Let kids know when 'hanging in there' pays off. The link between persistence and success is massive but persistence needs to be promoted. It's also the one factor of temperament that can be affected by parenting.

Being friendly

If your child struggles in social situations then recognise pro-social behaviours such as sharing, initiating contact with another child or taking an interest in another person.

Don't wait until you get perfect behaviour to give recognition, particularly for very young children. Kids have L-plates when it comes to behaving (co-operatively, bravely, patiently) so their attempts and close approximations need to be verified by the significant adults in their lives – their parents.

Recognising kids' positive behaviours is easy to do, but it's also easy not to do. We often get tied up with other things and forget to show appreciation and nurture the behaviours our kids need to develop. It's important to be aware of this. It's the little things such as giving positive recognition that have the biggest impact on kids' development.

<u>CSEF</u>

The Camps, Sports and Excursions fund application lodgment date has been extended until the end of November.

Families could receive up to **\$62.50 per child** if you hold a vaild means tested concession card (such as a health care card). Please note, this does not apply for families who have already received a CSEF rebate earlier this year. CSEF usage is normally restricted to camps, sports and excursions activities. As there is limited opportunity to undertake these activities this year, it was announced earlier that CSEF could be used for technology devices and internet access. CSEF usage has now been expanded further to include voluntary school charges, books and stationery. It may not be used for school uniforms, before/after school care, music lessons, formals/graduations or compulsory fees.

If you have recently qualified for a healthcare card or think you may be eligible, please contact Allison at the office as soon as possible.


Sacred Heart Christmas Candle Drive CLAIR SCENT DECOR
