UNIFORM:

The Sacred Heart Primary School uniform is an important symbol of the school's history and story, and it provides a tangible representation of our identity as a Catholic school. There are times when a school reflects on its uniform to ensure it is a proud representation of its identity and a practical one. Currently, we

have students wearing either the school jumper or polar fleece jacket as their outer garment with little consistency across the school.

A number of parents have been liaising with Academy Uniforms in regards to new jumper colours and texture. A new navy blue jumper will be introduced to replace the older royal blue jumper. Following discussions at school leadership level and consultation with the School Advisory Council, it has been decided that beginning in Term 1, 2023, all students will be expected to wear a jumper as the outer garment when wearing the school uniform and the polar fleece is to be worn as part of the sports uniform. If children are cold they are able to wear their polar fleece over the top of their school jumper on school uniform days but not as the only outside garment.

There will be a transition between the jumpers of three years and in this time students can wear either the old jumper (royal blue) or the new jumper (navy) as part of the school uniform but not the polar fleece alone. Any promotional materials moving forward will use the new jumper and school photos will be done with no jumper. The new jumpers will retail at the same price we have currently been selling jumpers at: Sizes 6-8 \$60 Size 10 \$65 Size 12 \$67 Size 14 \$70 Size 16 \$72. As we still have a number of the old jumpers available we will sell them at a discounted price of \$40.

The primary reason for this is to maintain more consistency between students and feedback from our parents to ensure there is consistency and a proud representation of the school's identity.

All uniforms can be purchased through our online store and will be placed in tubs. If we do not have sufficient numbers we will order more for the new school year.

SWIMMING PROGRAM:

The intensive swimming program for Term 4 started last Wednesday and will continue each Wednesday until 7th December. The children will need to wear their bathers under their uniform each Wednesday. BUILDING UPDATE - CHANGE TO COMPLETION DATE:

Our building project is rapidly approaching its completion although due to shipping of materials there has been a slight delay in the completion date. The architects and builders have now advised us that the building works will be delayed by a couple of weeks. Therefore our previously advertised work throughs will need to be delayed. We will have a formal Opening of this project early in 2023 when all of the external works are completed.

The times and dates for the 'Walk-throughs' this year will be advertised once completion is closer.

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT SHADE SAILS PROGRAM:

Today the shade sails outside the Community Centre/Administration Block were installed. These shade sails are a product of the Victorian Government Shade Sails Program established last year.



RUNNING CLUB:

The running club is on each Friday 8am on the school oval. This is run by one of our Dads, Dale Nardella (Sienna, Jack & Beau). If you would like to attend this please meet on the school oval at 8am.

BEGINNING OF 2023:

To encourage a positive and personal start to the new school year in 2023, we are staggering students' return to school, across all year levels. Students in Years One to Six will be allocated a morning or afternoon session on Monday 30th January or Tuesday 31st January.

During this session, teachers will spend time engaging with their students in a small group setting designed to enhance student wellbeing. These sessions may include time for the teachers and students to engage in various activities including reading, number work, classroom organisation and social and emotional (SEL) activities. We anticipate that this personalised opportunity will promote a calm and positive approach for students returning/commencing their 2023 school year.

Students are expected to wear full summer uniforms, including school hats. They are asked to bring a snack, drink bottle and pencil case with them to this session. Students' days and times will be shared with families over the coming weeks.

YEAR LEVEL PARENT REPRESENTATIVES:

In 2023 we are going to continue with a level parent representative or a couple of parent representatives for each level to play an important role in facilitating the continued building of our school community culture, starting from the ground up at class level. Other key aspects of the role include communication between school and parents, parents and school, support for the teacher and class activities.

Aim

To enhance the school environment, community and programs through the voluntary contribution of parents/guardians.

Appointment

We thank the 2022 parent representatives and encourage them to volunteer again if available. If parents are willing to volunteer, please email gmurphy@shdiamondcreek.catholic.edu.au with the Year level your child is in then we will be able allocate parents either at the end of the year or at the beginning of next year. More than one person may fill the position to share the load.

Activities

Year level representatives may, for example:

- Liaise with the teacher in regards to questions parents may have.
- Organise play dates and class events outside school.
- Help welcome new families.
- Organise meal rosters for families with new babies or going through hardships.
- Request parent help with classroom activities.
- They may be requested to facilitate fundraising activities or enlist volunteers for whole school activities.
- Circulate and promote information regarding fundraising projects and special activity days on behalf of the Teacher.
- Other activities as appropriate.

Mind your language. How what you say creates your child's mindset.



One of the big ideas in education over the past 10 years has been Professor Carol Dweck's work on Growth Mindset, However, despite (or perhaps because of) the hype, much of Dweck's work has been misunderstood, or misapplied. Too often we've tried to teach about growth mindset, instead of teaching for a growth mindset. Importantly, the role parents play in helping develop a growth mindset in their child has been largely overlooked.

In this article I share a simple way you can help your child develop a more growth-oriented mindset.

About Mindsets

Your child's mindset is how they view their most basic abilities, like their talents and intelligence, and it has a profound impact on their learning.

A child with a fixed mindset believes they are fundamentally limited. Who they are today, is pretty much who'll they be in the future. For them, school and learning is a way to discover those abilities. They'll ask if they are musical, or how smart they are. For these children, school becomes one long test to discover the answers to these questions.

A child with a growth mindset understands they have the capacity to develop their abilities. For them learning becomes a vehicle for creating and developing those abilities. You'll hear this child say things like "I want to become really good at maths, so I'm going to work hard to make that happen."

Why parents matter

Contrary to what social media might say, you can't just tell your child to have a growth mindset. Their mindset is rooted in a lifetime of experiences.

As parents we play an important role in creating the experiences that develop our child's mindset. What we repeatedly say, value, and reward all shape our child's mindset. And I should know because I got it wrong.

What I did wrong

When my daughter was young, I encouraged her to try lots of different activities. She tried music, art, gymnastics, singing, the Maths Olympics. You name it, we tried it. And that's fundamentally a good thing.

The problem wasn't what I was doing. It was the messages I attached to it. Sometimes when she wasn't keen to by a new activity, I'd say something like "Come on sweetheart, give it a go. You never know, you might be good at it!"

Can you hear the fixed message in there? "You might (already) be good at it."

I turned trying something new into a test to find out if she was good at it. I promised her the possibility of instant success. To make things worse, if she didn't have instant success, I'd often console her with something like "Well, don't worry. You can't be good at everything."

In other words, she'd failed that test. Now it was on to the next test to see if she was good at that instead. The unintended lesson: If you're not immediately good, give up.

Why did I do that?

If you just had an "ouch" moment, you're not alone. Parents say these types of things all the time. We say them out of love, and with the best of intentions.

When we see our child upset or struggling, our natural reaction is to want to protect them from that discomfort. But what I did was to provide my daughter with an excuse for struggle by saying "you're not that type of person."

Perhaps you've provided your child with a similar excuse by saying something similar like "I was never good at that either." The underlying message being "we aren't the right type of person to be good at that—we don't have those abilities."

A nudge in the right direction

To help us be better parents and nurture a more growth-oriented mindset in our children, we need a little nudge. A reminder that helps us counter any unconscious bias and ensure we create more growth-oriented messages for our children.

I've created lots of these nudges, for all types of situations. The one relevant to this situation is to remember that "Learning is about creating, not discovering."

Learning is about creating, not discovering.

In the context of trying new things, this nudge reminds us that we're not trying to find out if my daughter has those abilities. We're trying to decide if she wants to develop those abilities. So, now I might say:

"Darling, getting good at something takes time and the right type of effort. You need to decide if this is something you're prepared to invest the time and effort into getting good at."

The nudge helps us repeat this message over and over, slowly creating a more growth-oriented mindset. They become more empowered and see life as being in their control. They recognise they can become whoever they want, or need, to become

It's like George Bernard Shaw said, "Life is not about finding yourself. Life is about creating yourself."
